The Anglican Institute is a specialised learning community at Ridley College which seeks to train and equip future ordained leaders for the Anglican Church of Australia.

The Anglican Institute has three areas of focus:

- Missional Leadership Training and Formation teaching the core competencies required to be effective, as well helping students grow in godly character
- 2. Research and Publications providing opportunities for research into Anglican identity and practice, both its history and its contemporary expression and mission
- 3. Public Lectures and Conferences assisting churches and leaders be better equipped for future gospel ministry in the world

What do we want our Ridley Ordinands to be like?

- Mission minded able to create an evangelistic culture in both traditional Anglican contexts as well as in fresh expressions of church and church plants.
- Skilled in teaching the Bible and preaching the gospel
- Effective in leadership and able to build teams and set a creative vision
- Gifted in leading public worship
- Spiritually disciplined living a life of holiness forged through daily prayer and Bible study
- Strong in interpersonal skills being self aware and able to develop healthy relationships
- Theologically rigorous having a mature theological understanding demonstrated in preaching and a commitment to continued reading and study.

How will we achieve this?

- A comprehensive programme of teaching in Bible,
 Theology, and Practical Ministry units leading to
 a Master of Divinity, Master of Ministry, Bachelor of Theology,
 or Bachelor of Ministry.
- A Monday Anglican formation program including participation in Monday chapel services, plenary sessions and enrolment in units such as Anglican Identity; Anglican Prayer Book; Introduction to Reflective Practice, as well as Chapel and a ministry seminar.
- Field placements which include both traditional and missional churches
- · Encouraging mentoring opportunities.

How do I become part of the Anglican Institute?

Participation in the Monday Anglican Institute program requires completion of the application form on page 4 & 5, along with the Safe Ministry Clearance declaration on page 6. Those who have been accepted as ordination candidates will participate as full members of Anglican Institute. Those who are considering ordination and others electing to participate in Anglican Institute will become associate members of the Anglican Institute.

Expectations for Ordination Candidates

It is both a privilege and challenge to become a leader among God's people. Ridley devotes significant resources to training those who have been accepted as candidates for ordination in the Anglican Diocese of Melbourne, as well as for those preparing for ministry in the Australian Defence Force or in the Diocese of Tasmania, for example.

Monday Formation Program

Our Monday formation program in the Anglican Institute provides opportunity to learn liturgical, preaching and pastoral skills, to grow in our understanding of the national church, as well as to build relationships with a cohort of men and women who will become lifelong ministry peers.

We expect that candidates will be participants in the Monday program over two years.

Ridley Support

Outside of the Monday program, the Dean and the Associate Dean provide support, encouragement and advice as candidates navigate questions of discernment and pursue ministry opportunities as ordained clergy.

AngliCon

Each year we look forward to our ordinands and families camp – AngliCon – before second semester. This is a great opportunity for us to get to know the families of candidates, and for them to grow in support of each other. We encourage our students to approach their church to ask for support to attend AngliCon, which is subsidised by the College

Ministry Placements

Ordination candidates are encouraged to undertake a supervised field placement each year of their formation*. This is to be negotiated with the parish, either every Sunday of the academic year, or fewer hours per week over the calendar year. Those investigating ordination but not yet candidates are encouraged to consider such a placement too. In addition, students are encouraged to undertake a 40 hour placement in the middle of the year in a setting different from their regular parish placement.

Theological Study

The Anglican Diocese of Melbourne expects its ministers to undertake theological study before their ordination. Normally, this means completing the equivalent of four full-time years of theological study, comprising a degree and a diploma. We are part of a tradition that values a learned clergy, who provide leadership in both church and the community. In our complex pastoral and cultural settings, the skills and reflection required of an ordained person are more and more demanding. We can be thankful that the Anglican Church of Australia recognises the responsibilities of ministry and the value of training that is both academically rigorous and pastorally applied.

Alongside regular units required for the degree, ordination candidates are expected to include the following units (in either their degree or diploma):

EM	Gospel and Gospel Ministry
(or)	Introduction to Personal Evangelism (6cps)
PC	Pastoral Care
(or)	Pastoral Skills and Methods
PC	Christian Worship
PC	Introduction to Christian Leadership
(or)	Principles of Leadership and Management
PC	Preaching
PE	Theological Ethics
TH	The Church and its Ministry
CH (or PC)	Anglican Identity (6cps) and
PC (or CH)	Anglican Prayer Book (6cps)
PC	Introduction to Reflective Practice
(with)	Supervised Theological Field Education
PC	Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE)

Note that some of these units will not be offered at Ridley every year. Students are encouraged to make an appointment with the Academic Counsellor for assistance with course planning. Email studentsupport@ridley.edu.au to arrange an appointment.





Costs of Membership

Anglican Institute Fees

These amounts are payable directly to Ridley College and cannot be allocated to FEE-Help.

Full Membership of the Anglican Institute is available to candidates for Ordination.

- The Anglican Institute program for members comprises: Monday Chapel; Lunch; Vocational Mentoring Group; Preparation for Anglican Ministry (exiting ordination candidates only); Ordination Candidates Camp.
- Candidates for Ordination are required to pay \$500 (plus GST) per semester for the AI Training Fee in 2024. Students will be invoiced for these amounts in May and October.

Associate Membership of the Anglican Institute is available to students considering ordination or in the Year of Discernment.

 Students who are accepted into Associate Membership are required to pay \$250 (plus GST) for Monday Chapel, Monday Lunch, and Vocational Mentoring Group. Students will be invoiced for these amounts in May and October.

Fee discounts and subsidies (applicable to tuition fees only)

- Hunter Scott Scholarships: Available for training of ordinands or ordained ministers.
- Ellen Margaret Taylor Bursary: Available for women studying theology, with preference given to women from country Victoria.
